Luke 20:9-19

Parable of the Evil Farmers

9 Now Jesus turned to the people again and told them this story: "A man planted a vineyard, leased it to tenant farmers, and moved to another country to live for several years. 10 At the time of the grape harvest, he sent one of his servants to collect his share of the crop. But the farmers attacked the servant, beat him up, and sent him back emptyhanded.

11 So the owner sent another servant, but they also insulted him, beat him up, and sent him away emptyhanded. 12 A third man was sent, and they wounded him and chased him away. 13 "What will I do?' the owner asked himself. 'I know! I'll send my cherished son. Surely they will respect him.'

14 "But when the tenant farmers saw his son, they said to each other, 'Here comes the heir to this estate. Let's kill him and get the estate for ourselves!'
15 So they dragged him out of the vineyard and murdered him.

"What do you suppose the owner of the vineyard will do to them?" Jesus asked.

16 "I'll tell you—he will come and kill those farmers and lease the vineyard to others." "How terrible that such a thing should ever happen," his listeners protested. 17 Jesus looked at them and said, "Then what does this Scripture mean? 'The stone that the builders rejected has now become the cornerstone.'

18 Everyone who stumbles over that stone will be broken to pieces, and it will crush anyone it falls on." **19** The teachers of religious law and the leading priests wanted to arrest Jesus immediately because they realized he was telling the story against themthey were the wicked farmers. But they were afraid of the people's reaction.

How Do You Tell A Story Without Actually Telling The Story?

 A familiar piece of Middle Eastern agriculture...a Vineyard.
 (Common saying: Each man under his own fig tree: I Kings 4:25, ;Isaiah 34:4, others) How Do You Tell A Story Without Actually Telling The Story?

Here is a true allegory...parts represent something else in real life.
 (A man...God Tenants...Religious leaders)

Tenant Farmers, Share Croppers... Share The Harvest with the Owner

The temptation is to keep the whole crop.

- Once the goods are in our hands it can be tough to voluntarily release our grip on the goods.
- Shameful behavior....beating and wounding those sent to give the owner his due.
- And the son....even worse! Throw him outside the vineyard and kill the boy!


