Luke 22:63- 23:25

Jesus Prays on the Mount of Olives

⁶³ The guards in charge of Jesus began mocking and beating him. ⁶⁴ They blindfolded him and said, "Prophesy to us! Who hit you that time?" ⁶⁵ And they hurled all sorts of terrible insults at him.

Jesus before the Council

⁶⁶ At daybreak all the elders of the people assembled, including the leading priests and the teachers of religious law. Jesus was led before this high council, ⁶⁷ and they said, "Tell us, are you the Messiah?"

But he replied, "If I tell you, you won't believe me. ⁶⁸ And if I ask you a question, you won't answer. ⁶⁹ But from now on the Son of Man will be seated in the place of power at God's right hand."

⁷⁰ They all shouted, "So, are you claiming to be the Son of God?"

And he replied, "You say that I am."

⁷¹ "Why do we need other witnesses?" they said. "We ourselves heard him say it."

Luke 23

Jesus' Trial before Pilate

¹ Then the entire council took Jesus to Pilate, the Roman governor. ² They began to state their case: "This man has been leading our people astray by telling them not to pay their taxes to the Roman government and by claiming he is the Messiah, a king." ³ So Pilate asked him, "Are you the king of the Jews?"

Jesus replied, "You have said it."

⁴ Pilate turned to the leading priests and to the crowd and said, "I find nothing wrong with this man!"

- ⁵ Then they became insistent. "But he is causing riots by his teaching wherever he goes—all over Judea, from Galilee to Jerusalem!"
- ⁶ "Oh, is he a Galilean?" Pilate asked. ⁷ When they said that he was, Pilate sent him to Herod Antipas, because Galilee was under Herod's jurisdiction, and Herod happened to be in Jerusalem at the time.
- ⁸ Herod was delighted at the opportunity to see Jesus, because he had heard about him and had been hoping for a long time to see him perform a miracle.

- ⁹ He asked Jesus question after question, but Jesus refused to answer. ¹⁰ Meanwhile, the leading priests and the teachers of religious law stood there shouting their accusations. ¹¹ Then Herod and his soldiers began mocking and ridiculing Jesus. Finally, they put a royal robe on him and sent him back to Pilate. ¹² (Herod and Pilate, who had been enemies before, became friends that day.)
- ¹³ Then Pilate called together the leading priests and other religious leaders, along with the people, ¹⁴ and he announced his verdict.

"You brought this man to me, accusing him of leading a revolt. I have examined him thoroughly on this point in your presence and find him innocent. ¹⁵ Herod came to the same conclusion and sent him back to us. Nothing this man has done calls for the death penalty. ¹⁶ So I will have him flogged, and then I will release him."

¹⁸ Then a mighty roar rose from the crowd, and with one voice they shouted, "Kill him, and release Barabbas to us!" ¹⁹ (Barabbas was in prison for taking part in an insurrection in Jerusalem against the government, and for murder.)

- ²⁰ Pilate argued with them, because he wanted to release Jesus.
- ²¹ But they kept shouting, "Crucify him! Crucify him!"
- For the third time he demanded, "Why? What crime has he committed? I have found no reason to sentence him to death. So I will have him flogged, and then I will release him."
- ²³ But the mob shouted louder and louder, demanding that Jesus be crucified, and their voices prevailed. ²⁴ So Pilate sentenced Jesus to die as they demanded. ²⁵ As they had requested, he released Barabbas, the man in prison for insurrection and murder. But he turned Jesus over to them to do as they wished.

- Finally...all of the horrid predictions of Isaiah 53 are played out in black and blue.
- ❖ Good Friday was about more than a cross and nails. Whips, a thorny crown and a beating were the dark prelude to Calvary.
- And to think that release from it all was a mere prayer away.
- How do I fit into this bloody picture?

- 4. Pilate...the reluctant judge. "Not worthy of death!" Luke 23:1-4
- 5. Oh, but he is a Galilean and Herod is in town. Luke 23:6-12
- 6. Pilate can't escape his role...spineless, he simply 'surrendered Jesus to their will'.
