

Saul's Conversion

¹ Meanwhile, Saul was still breathing out murderous threats against the Lord's disciples. He went to the high priest ² and asked him for letters to the synagogues in Damascus, so that if he found any there who belonged to the Way, whether men or women, he might take them as prisoners to Jerusalem. ³ As he neared Damascus on his journey, suddenly a light from heaven flashed around him. ⁴ He fell to the ground and heard a voice say to him, "Saul, Saul, why do you persecute me?" ⁵ "Who are you, Lord?" Saul asked.

"I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting," he replied. ⁶ "Now get up and go into the city, and you will be told what you must do."

⁷ The men traveling with Saul stood there speechless; they heard the sound but did not see anyone. ⁸ Saul got up from the ground, but when he opened his eyes he could see nothing. So they led him by the hand into Damascus. ⁹ For three days he was blind, and did not eat or drink anything.

¹⁰ In Damascus there was a disciple named Ananias. The Lord called to him in a vision, "Ananias!"

"Yes, Lord," he answered.

¹¹ The Lord told him, "Go to the house of Judas on Straight Street and ask for a man from Tarsus named Saul, for he is praying. ¹² In a vision he has seen a man named Ananias come and place his hands on him to restore his sight."

¹³ "Lord," Ananias answered, "I have heard many reports about this man and all the harm he has done to your holy people in Jerusalem. ¹⁴ And he has come here with authority from the chief priests to arrest all who call on your name."

¹⁵ But the Lord said to Ananias, "Go! This man is my chosen instrument to proclaim my name to the Gentiles and their kings and to the people of Israel. ¹⁶ I will show him how much he must suffer for my name."

¹⁷ Then Ananias went to the house and entered it. Placing his hands on Saul, he said, "Brother Saul, the Lord—Jesus, who appeared to you on the road as you were coming here—has sent me so that you may see again and be filled with the Holy Spirit."

¹⁸ Immediately, something like scales fell from Saul's eyes, and he could see again. He got up and was baptized, ¹⁹ and after taking some food, he regained his strength.

Saul in Damascus and Jerusalem

Saul spent several days with the disciples in Damascus. ²⁰ At once he began to preach in the synagogues that Jesus is the Son of God.

You know you have made God after your own image when God has the same enemies as you.

TAKE HOME

Catch Them If We Can -Acts 9:1-2

- It's not enough to chase "God's enemies" out ...Saul was bent on chasing them down.
- With letters seeking extradition, he even ran off to foreign lands in search "God's enemies". (Acts 26:11)
- He voted with those who sought the death penalty for those of The Way. Acts 26:10



THOUGHT:

The troubling thing about Paul was: He loved God and thought he was doing God's will. He thought he was doing the right thing. (Sadly, we are all guilty of this)

Hammered On The Highway -Acts 9:3-5

- How's that for a 'stop' light! Brighter than the sun. (How has God tried to get your attention?)
- Surprise, surprise! Who are you, Lord? Jesus? (Our concepts of God fall short)
- Why are you persecuting me? "It was the Head in heaven crying out on behalf of the members which were still on earth" --Augustine



In Damascus You'll Learn What This Is All About -Acts 9:6-9

- Blind, he is led to a place of repentance and renewal (We all need new eyes)
- Dubious Ananias gets his assignment: "Go find the Terrorist!" (Even the Christian needed a lesson in unconditional love)
- Confused Ananias: "But Lord!" (Loving is difficult) God: "Go ahead, Saul has had a vision and you are in it."



Stranger Than Fiction... Saul Is God's Chosen Emissary

- God has a plan and purpose for everyone, even murderous Paul (Difficult truth: God has a purpose for those you detest, too)
- Speak love. The strangest words ever: "Brother Saul" --Brother?!
- Baptism binds us together. Baptizing "enemies" brings about the unimaginable.



Lessons For Ananias

- Love your enemies. Who'd have guessed he would ever say such things? "Jesus is the Son of God"
- Move beyond presumption. Of course the first reaction was astonishment and disbelief. What would you expect?
- Break through. Ananias broke through the difficult and experienced the miraculous.



Saul's Conversion ...Anything Is Possible With God

- Spoken word: His testimony would be solid evidence of the power of the Gospel.
- Written word: He wrote more books of the New Testament.
- Living word: He planted countless churches. His impact on the world is beyond measure.

- 3. Love you Enemy.


- (1) I know I love God because I love my Neighbor.
